

# The Word of the Laird



As Mark continues his first chapter of his Gospel, he now portrays Jesus in several different roles. He cites Him as being in Capernaum. It is thought that Jesus made Capernaum the basis for His activity. The fact that He teaches in their synagogue indicates that He is over thirty years of age. Commenting on the books of Moses was limited to the Levites, but commenting on the other books could be done by any male over thirty.

Then Mark gives us the encounter with the man possessed by a diabolical spirit. While the spirit knows who Jesus is, Jesus rebukes such testimony and orders the spirit to come out of the man, which the spirit does with a loud cry and convulsion.

Later in Chapter 1 we will also find Jesus carrying out His role as a healer or thaumaturge. This will be specifically for Peter's mother-inlaw. It may be noteworthy that both the expulsion of the evil spirit and the healing of Peter's mother-in-law occur on a sabbath. The issue of healing on the sabbath is one that will be brought up later as a violation of rabbinic regulations.

Mark is building up the basis on which people will be brought to put their faith in Jesus. For us, too, the various ways in which Jesus carries out His ministry among us, through the scriptures and the sacraments, draws us to Him more closely.

## A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FOR-MATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This weekend we celebrate the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time, and the readings speak to the importance of living and proclaiming our faith. The two should actually be one - because in living our faith for others to see, we are proclaiming the goodness of God. We share our faith in all we do, at work, home, when we're grocery shopping, when we're paying our bills—you get the idea. The readings for this weekend provoked in me a sense of both urgency and determination because as Christians we are called to live our life in Christ, and unfortunately, we don't always make that a priority. Our human sense of self usually leads our way.

Todays first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy re-

lates Moses speaking to his people and sharing the good news of the savior that is to come. "I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him." We are told to LISTEN to Christ because in doing that we are listening to GOD. Jesus directs our path – all we need to do is follow.

Our second reading from **St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians** begins with an expression of care, "*Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties.*" That one simple line spoke to me, as I'm sure it speaks to many of you. We live in a world that causes anxiety and so many of us personally experience that. St. Paul is reminding us that we will have difficulty in living our priorities, as in life much is expected of us. The example he gives connects directly to our sense of primacy – what is more important, living for God or living for others? That can cause division. Now, I'm certainly not one to disagree with St. Paul but I think the message is a little convoluted. Living for others IS living for God. In helping others, and loving others, we are sharing God's love in all we do.

Our gospel passage from **St. Mark** finds Jesus in the Temple, teaching them "as one having authority." Jesus encounters a man possessed with an "unclean spirit" who cries out, "I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus saves the man to the astonishment of those around him. "All were amazed and asked one another, 'What is this? A new teaching with authority". They were finally starting to get it – this man is special. We get it too – we KNOW that Jesus is "the way, the truth and the life," and we understand that his teachings are what we follow – listening to Jesus is what we do and who we are. Let's always take time, in every circumstance, to listen to Jesus and to have his voice settle in our hearts and live there. Honestly, there is no better way to live.
