

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This week we celebrate the **5th Sunday of Easter** and our readings for the Sunday liturgy are filled with thought provoking beauty and love.

Our first reading from the **Acts of the Apostles** finds Saul joining the disciples in Jerusalem. Like all newcomers to a group, it took some time for Saul to "fit in." His friend Barnabas *"took charge of him"* and the disciples accepted him. The last line of this reading is one that we long to hear in our world today – *"the church was at peace."* Our world is lacking peace in many forms, even within the church. There is division in our world that has slowly trickled into the church as well, and it's up to us to build up what has been torn down. Yet, if we are to live in peace, we must find common ground. Oh wait! We already have it! We have Jesus, and that is where our focus should always remain.

The second reading from **1 John** gives us advice on how to do just that.

"Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything." Now that's some great advice – let us live in "deed and truth." In other words, we live for God in how we act and in what we believe, and this week's gospel guides us on how to do that.

In the gospel from John, we find Jesus likening himself to a vine. God is the vine grower, and we are the branches that must be pruned and nourished to grow and bear fruit. We all know how to do that. We need to nourish our faith so that we bear the fruit of God's love and share it with others. Jesus tells us to *"remain in me, as I remain in you."* Did you get that? We are a part of God, and God is in us! We are children of God, created out of love and called to share that love with all. We strengthen ourselves by nourishing our souls with God's love through all the sacraments, but most especially through receiving Jesus himself in the Holy Eucharist. This nourishes us so that we, as the branches, can *"bear much fruit and become [his] disciples."* What a blessing it is to know that we are loved so much by God that he "remains" with us. As a matter of fact, the word "remain" is used seven times in this passage. It's a great word. Remain – stay, hold the course, persevere. I will never look at that word in the same way again. Now that word invokes love in the knowledge that Jesus REMAINS in me. He remains in and with all of us if we just let him in.

When we gather as one family of Christ at Mass, we listen, we pray, and most importantly, we RECEIVE. We receive the joy of coming together in prayer, thanksgiving, and love. We receive our Lord in the Holy Eucharist and then we go forth to proclaim God's kingdom – and that can be tough, especially in today's climate. Yet we don't do it alone. We **remain** together—united with God and one another through prayer and sacrament – which gives us the nourishment, that is, the needed grace to live in (and share) the love of God. We are invited to a banquet every week, but we need to accept the invitation because it is there we are strengthened with "food" for the journey. I hope I've given you some "food for thought" as well.
