

# The Word of the Laird



In today's first reading from Isaiah, we hear God saying, "See, I am doing something new!"

That is precisely what Jesus does in our Gospel reading from John. The woman who had been caught in adultery is brought to Jesus (the man should also have been brought, but that is not explained why he wasn't). Both Leviticus and Deuteronomy require a death punishment for anyone caught committing adultery. When Jesus is confronted with this situation, he bends down and starts writing on the ground. We are not told what He wrote. The scribes and Pharisees continued asking Him about this. His response was, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to cast a stone at her." Again, He writes on the ground. While John does not tell us what Jesus wrote, it has been conjectured that He wrote some of their names and possible impure connections they may have had. With that, the scribes and Pharisees start leaving.

With no one left to condemn her, nor does Jesus. But He admonishes her not to sin anymore.

As we approach the end of our Lenten season, may we also leave behind any sinful habits or behaviors that have kept us from realizing the activity of God's grace in our lives. May we approach the days of Holy Week and Easter with clear consciences and renewed devotion to doing good.
