

The Word of the Laird



I am pleased to report that last Sunday, for our holy three-quarter hour, we had over a dozen people in church! In view of that number attending, I think it best to make the noon to one o'clock hour our standard. I want to thank everyone who attended and hope that more will consider setting some time aside (maybe not necessarily the whole hour) for spending time with the Lord in the Eucharist.

Today's Gospel reading has the call of the first disciples. It might be inferred that from the time of His baptism by John the Baptist until the time of the Baptist's arrest, Jesus was a disciple of John. But now, with John being arrested by Herod, Jesus makes that the occasion to begin His own ministry. He calls two sets of brothers, Peter and Andrew, James and John. His calling them to be "fishers of men" had an eschatological ring to it. The end times are getting nearer and the harvest of humans for the Kingdom is now becoming more urgent.

Our pre-Mass prayers for vocations echo Jesus' call. I hope that they will inspire some of our young men to look into the possibility of priesthood for their life's work. This year will make forty-eight years that I have been a priest. I worked in parishes, I worked in the Diocesan Tribunal where we did marriage annulments. I was a delegate of Bishop Clark administering the sacrament of confirmation around the diocese for twenty-one years. While there have been some moments that presented challenges, for the most part I feel that my ministry has been a blessing for me and for the people I have served. I hope that we will have more of our young men giving this consideration.
