

The Word of the Laird



In today's first reading, Habakkuk is facing a situation that is extremely negative. The Chaldeans have been increasing in power against the Israelites. King Joachim was exercising a tyrannical reign of Judah. Against this background Habakkuk cries out, "I cry for help but you do not listen!" The rest of Chapter 1 is a description of the evils being perpetrated. That then brings us to the verse from Chapter 2, "the just one, because of his faith, shall live."

The Gospel has the Apostles pleading, "increase our faith." Jesus responds with an answer that can only be described as hyperbole, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

Paul, who is imprisoned, exhorts Timothy "to stir into flame the gift of God that you have received through the imposition of my hands...Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus."

May our hearts be enriched and strengthened by the gift of faith that was given us at baptism and is renewed and strengthened every time we share in the Eucharist.

A NOTE FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY:

Dear Church Family,

This week we celebrate the **27**th **Sunday in Ordinary Time**, and our readings focus on faith.

Faith is defined as "an assurance and conviction of what we believe and know to be true." How do we make sense of our faith in the world we live in today? Some of us need hard evidence to believe, but faith is not tangible, and even the most faithful among us at times need that extra nudge of assurance. So, I'll ask you - how sure are you of your faith? How convicted are you to your faith?

Honestly, our humanity causes us to sometimes waiver in our belief. There are times our faith is fragile. We just might be having one of those days when we're overworked, tired, and everything just seems to be crashing around us. Suffering devastation and loss, however we experience that, can also bring us to doubt and question.

Faith and religion are two different things. Our faith sustains us. Our religion feeds our faith – if we allow it to. There is so much beauty in the liturgy, in our community, in the sacraments – most especially the Holy Eucharist – which, through regular reception, can only strengthen our convictions of true faith. We, as Christians, are called to be people of faith, to be disciples, yet we still doubt – that's just the reality of it. Even the most faith-filled individuals, at times, struggle with faith.

At youth group last evening we talked about faith and doubt. I read this to the kids: "I feel that God does not want me, that God is not God and that He does not really exist....My smile is a great cloak that hides a multitude of pains." That statement came from the diary of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who also stated in her diary that from 1948 on she experienced only "brief interludes of belief." These were the writings of a saint! We also know that St. Thomas suffered from doubt, as did some of the other disciples and so many of our saints. St. John of the Cross wrote in The Dark Night of the Soul, "Before the soul is exalted, it is humbled; and before it is humbled, it is exalted." Sr. Joan Chittister says, "Darkness deserves gratitude. It is the alleluia point at which we learn to understand that all growth does not take place in the sunlight."

Our faith requires work! It doesn't have to be great, or strong, or even constant. Faith just needs to *be*. Every day, the simple, beautiful moments we experience supply us with the confidence that God loves us, and that we belong to him. That knowledge is so important, and it's reiterated in simple acts of kindness—whether we are the recipients of, or those sharing it. Those straightforward everyday connections that give us hope, strengthen and sustain our faith. Where there is hope and charity — there is faith.

St. Timothy, in this weekend's second reading puts it this way, "... bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." (2Tim 1:8). We don't have to do any of this alone. We are never alone. God is always there to guide us out of our darkness of doubt, and to help us keep reaching for the light.



For the past 2.5 years the Clothing Closet has served the community by providing FREE clothes, blankets, shoes, sheets, and towels. We are open on Friday and Saturday from 10am-12pm and staffed by over 30 dedicated volunteers.

Donations of gently used clothes from the community, make it possible for us to provide for others. As the economy continues to challenge our community, it is important we continue to help in this very meaningful and valuable way.

To provide a little insight as to the success of this ministry, the past 9 weeks we have been tracking the number of families shopping, new families shopping, and number of items (clothes, shoes, sheets, blankets and towels) families have benefitted from receiving.


Current Needs: we are always in need of towels of all sizes, larger size clothing 1x-4x for men and women, hoodies, and boys/girl teen clothes.

There is perhaps no more beautiful celebration than when parents bring their newborn child to the waters of baptism. Parents, godparents, family, and friends share in this sacrament with incomparable joy. For in baptism, we share in Christ's death and resurrection, and through the outward signs of water and oil, are made children of God and given the hope of eternal life with Him.

"The death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith and the basis of our hope."1 Through our Lord Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven, death is overcome, and life is victorious. "Hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite not knowing what the future may bring."2 Because of this Christian hope, we can face the unknown trials of life with faith rather than fear.

We are called to be signs of hope to all people, especially those whose goodness, value, and dignity are undermined. As members of the Body of Christ, we carry this hope with us as we continue Jesus' mission on earth. Pope Leo XIV encourages us, "How important it is that each and every baptized person feel himself or herself called by God to be a sign of hope in the world today."3

Sadly, there is a devastating absence of hope today. We see this most profoundly in a sweeping disregard for human life in its most vulnerable forms and stages. Abortion and assisted suicide are products of "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us." Romans 5:5

hopelessness and despair. Yet even amid the increasing attacks on human life, we know that the "storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death."4

We have been entrusted with a message of hope for the woman who finds herself unexpectedly pregnant or for the man diagnosed with a terminal illness. At these challenging moments, we must bring God's presence, witnessing to His love, and inspiring a renewal of hope in those whose hearts are burdened. For "hope is born of love and based on the love springing from the pierced heart of Jesus upon the cross."5

Having been "buried with Christ in Baptism, we receive in his resurrection the gift of a new life that breaks down the walls of death." Confident of God's presence within us, may we share the Gospel of Life with those most in need of hope, knowing that "the grace of God precedes and accompanies his people as they press forward firm in faith, active in charity and steadfast in hope."7
